**WHEREAS**, for the second consecutive year and the 7<sup>th</sup> time in school history, the Carrboro Jaguars have earned the title of Women’s Cross Country 2A State Champions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Carrboro High School Women’s Cross Country team is led by Head Coach Mimi O’Grady, with support from the rest of the cross country coaching staff: Riley Mulhern, Lucas Lyons, Aubrey Curl and Matt Straub; and

**WHEREAS**, the following runners contributed to Carrboro High School’s success at the championship event: Emery Hoos, grade 12; Louise Lounes, grade 12; Selia Lounes, grade 12; Lia Miller, grade 12; Hannah Preisser, grade 10; Madeline Ramsden, grade 11; Cora Van Raay, grade 12; and alternates Hayley Guerry, Kate Chenet, and Rachel Buck; and

**WHEREAS**, all of Carrboro’s runners finished in the top 30 out of a field of 153, resulting in a decisive first place win for the team; their overall score of 38 points not only surpassed the second place team by 20 points, it was also the best score of any category, either men’s or women’s, for the 2019 State Championship; and

**WHEREAS**, in addition to the runners who participated in the State Championship, the team has a total of 26 members; every runner contributes to the championship culture and spirit of excellence; and

**WHEREAS**, the success of this team is a testament to the dedication of these athletes whose rigorous training, mental toughness and strong teamwork exemplify the best of high school athletics; and

**WHEREAS**, the Carrboro Town Council is extremely proud of the accomplishments of these student-athletes.
