PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO CONSENTING TO APPLICATION OF THE EXTENSION OF THE PROCLAMATION OF ORANGE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA DATED MARCH 25, 2020 WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF CARRBORO

WHEREAS, Orange County Board of Commissioners Chair Penny Rich has signed a Proclamation ordering further restrictions on activity of residents of Orange County in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Crisis; and

WHEREAS, said proclamation and the restrictions contained therein may be made applicable within the Town of Carrboro's jurisdiction with the consent of the Mayor of Carrboro pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. 166A-19.22(b)(2).

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Lydia E. Lavelle, Mayor of the Town of Carrboro, do hereby proclaim the continued existence of a STATE OF EMERGENCY within the Town of Carrboro, and, pursuant to the authority granted to me by State law and Town ordinance, hereby ORDER as follows:

- 1. For the reasons and based on the findings stated in the attached Proclamation of the Chair of the Orange County Board of Commissioners, I consent to the application of said Proclamation within the Town of Carrboro pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. 166A-19.22(b)(2).
- 2. Except as modified by this Proclamation, all of the terms of the Proclamation declaring a State of Emergency in the Town of Carrboro dated March 13, 2020 and signed by Mayor Lavelle shall remain in full force and effect.

This Proclamation shall be effective April 24, 2020 at 4:00pm (Eastern Daylight Time) and remain in effect until properly rescinded or modified by subsequent Proclamation.
