	Vicki Rovine called the meeting to order.

	Camilla Crane shared her experience and appreciation for working as an apprentice with The ArtsCenter. She splitted between administrative tasks and arts education, including the arts camps. Dan Mayer expressed appreciation for Camilla’s work and indicated it was also a great experience for The ArtsCenter.
4.	Art on the Hill Update – Funding Consideration and Timeline

	Charles Harrington provided information on the upcoming soft opening/virtual art shows for Town Hall and the Century Center.
	Charles Harrington and Dan Mayer provided an update on the Town Comprehensive Plan and the upcoming review by advisory boards to occur in October. Dan reviewed key themes/areas of public interest during the process including festivals, public art, placemaking, and intersectionality. Discussion of larger themes related to racial equity and climate action. The committee discussed ways to measure engagement with public art.

Those interested should reach out to her or Charles Harrington.</p> <p>Discussion continued regarding public art opportunities at the new Estes Dr./N. Greensboro St. roundabout. Charles Harrington indicated NCDOT is still working on traffic and safety issues at the site, but the Town is aware of interest in art in this space if possible. Other similar opportunities such as colorful crosswalks, electrical boxes, etc. were discussed. Committee members were not in favor of the electrical boxes and Justin Haslett provided feedback from Chapel Hill's experience with painted crosswalks and the difficulty and cost associated with maintaining them.</p>
