FOOD

Chapel Hill Carrboro City Schools (CHCCS) is distributing pre-packaged, grab-and-go lunch and a snack to children, ages 0-18, to over 20 sites in the school district. For locations and more information in multiple languages see [these flyers](#).

Inter-Faith Council (IFC) serves hot meals daily (lunch daily, dinner Monday – Friday) and has a food pantry available.

Meals on Wheels delivers meals to older adults once a week.

Orange County Senior Centers Providing to go meals 3 times a week (with additional food to cover another 2 days a week). Call 919-942-9559 for more information.

PORCH provides grocery gift cards to families in need.

RENA Community Center provides food to families in the Rogers Road/Eubanks Road area twice a month on Fridays.

Table delivers bags of healthy non-perishables and fresh food to families with children in the Chapel Hill Carrboro City School (CHCCS) system.

EMPLOYMENT AND SMALL BUSINESS ASSISTANCE

Unemployment Assistance: On March 17, Governor Cooper announced that barriers to state unemployment benefits have been removed for workers of businesses impacted by COVID-19, including:

- o Eliminating the one-week waiting period
- o Allowing individuals to receive unemployment benefits without being required to actively look for new jobs
- o Employees who lose their jobs and those who have reduced hours due to COVID-19 Removing the requirement that individuals must have in-person interviews prior to qualifying for benefits. This initial intake can now be done remotely, either by phone or online.
- o Employers will not be required to help pay for their former workers' unemployment benefits

Child Care Services Association: The COVID-19 Relief Fund to help families and child care programs in North Carolina with urgent and long-term expenses during the COVID-19 pandemic, including paying for childcare.

The **Orange County Arts Commission:** Provides funding assistance for artists and organizations who have been impacted by COVID-19.

Carrboro Small Business and Nonprofit Loan/Grant COVID-19 Emergency Fund: Provides assistance to Carrboro based businesses and non-profits that serve Carrboro with short term payroll during the State/Town declared COVID 19 Emergency in order to maintain employees.

Orange County Small Business Emergency Funding Program: Provides funds for Orange County small businesses experiencing revenue loss due to the coronavirus pandemic in the form of both grants and loans.

Carrboro United Local Food Hub: To assist Carrboro and Chapel Hill's suffering food service economy, Carrboro United serves as a central food hub for local restaurants and farms for the duration of the Covid-19 outbreak.

Small Business Administration Loan Program: Provides low-interest loans for small businesses and nonprofits who have been severely impacted by COVID-19.

Cardinal Innovations: In response to COVID-19, offers grant funding to community nonprofits.

RENT AND UTILITIES

Spectrum Internet is offering free broadband and Wi-Fi access for 60 days (March 16 – May 15) for families with K-12 and/or college students who do not already have a Spectrum plan.

Call 1-844-488-8395 to get set up.

OWASA: OWASA has temporarily suspended all disconnects for non-payment of bills.

Duke Energy: Duke Energy will not disconnect any customer's service for non-payment. The company will continue to read meters and send bills. Customers should pay what they can to avoid building up a large balance.

Dominion Energy: Dominion Energy will not disconnect any customer's service for non-payment. They also offer short term payment extensions and long term payment assistance.

Major cellphone carriers, including T-Mobile, Verizon, AT&T, Sprint, will keep users connected and waive late fees for 60 days.

Rental and Utility Assistance: Several organizations provide financial assistance to low-income households facing challenges paying rent, utilities, and other critical household expenses:

Inter-Faith Council: Schedule an appointment by calling **919-929-6380 x19** 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Orange County: Orange County provides emergency assistance to low-income residents of Orange County. For more information, call **919-245-2490**.

Town of Carrboro: The Town provides assistance with rent, security deposits and utility connection fees for low-income residents who find or have housing in Carrboro. For more information, please call **919-918-7321**.

Central Piedmont Community Action: Provides assistance with housing (deposits and first month's rent), training expenses, employment expenses, transportation, child care, past due rent/utilities, healthcare expenses, gas for vehicles and groceries.
